

Waiting at Home for Emergency Surgery

You need surgery but your surgeon has said you can safely wait at home.

How do I know when I am having surgery?

You do not have a scheduled time yet but it will be done within the next few days. We will call you tomorrow (the day after you leave) by 4 PM. We will tell you what day and time to come to the hospital. Please write that information in the box below.

** Do not call the hospital **, we will call you.

Arrival day & time:
At Richmond Hospital, go to:
☐ Surgical Day Care Admitting, Red Zone -> Enter through the South Entrance.
Walk through the 2 nd set of glass doors, turn left and walk down hallway. Walk
past the door and turn left. The entrance is immediately to your right.
☐ Emergency Admitting, Red Zone -> Enter through Emergency.
If your condition gets worse before your surgery, go to the hospital emergency department.
If your surgery is postponed, you will return home and can eat normally on that day. Follow
the instructions from step 1 of this document. We will call you by 4 PM the following day with
further instructions.
STEPS TO PREPARE FOR SURGERY ☐ Check off each item once it is done.
1. Starting right NOW
Your surgery could be cancelled if you do not follow these instructions.
☐ Stop smoking, drinking alcohol, and using any recreational drugs.
☐ If you are taking any medications <u>and</u> your surgeon has not told you whether to continue
or stop, please call your surgeon, Dr at
☐ If you do not speak English well enough to understand medical terms, bring someone
with you who can speak both English and your language to interpret. This person needs
to stay with you until you go in for surgery, and be available right after surgery.
☐ Arrange for someone to look after you for 24 hours, and for someone to give you a ride
home 1 to 4 hours after your surgery (this could be as late as 11 PM). If staying overnight,
you will normally be discharged around 9 AM. This person needs to be available to
come when we call. You can take a taxi home but only if you have an adult with you (in
addition to the taxi driver). You will not be allowed to walk home from the hospital.

2.	The EVENING before your surgery
	☐ Take a bath or shower. Wash your hair.
	\square Remove all nail polish from your fingers <u>and</u> toes. You can leave false fingernails on but it
	has to be clear polish only. We need to see your fingernails or toenails to check your
	circulation during surgery.
3.	Starting at MIDNIGHT
	□ DO NOT EAT OR DRINK ANYTHING AFTER MIDNIGHT. This includes:
	X No water, gum, candy or chewing tobacco
	X Do not swallow any water or liquids when you brush your teeth
4.	The MORNING of surgery
	☐ If your surgeon has told you to take your medication on the morning of your surgery, take
	the medication with a very small sip of water.
	☐ Keep your phone close by in case we need to contact you.
	☐ Take another bath or shower.
	□ No skin lotions, hair gels, or perfumes.
	☐ Dentures OK but no adhesive.
	☐ Tie back long hair. Do not use bobby pins or elastics with metal.
	☐ Remove ALL jewelry, including face, ear, tongue, and other body piercings.
	If we need to use cautery equipment during your surgery, your skin may be burned if you are
	wearing metal jewelry or accessories.
5.	What to BRING TO THE HOSPITAL
	☐ Personal health card <u>and</u> photo identification.
	☐ All prescription medications in their original containers.
	☐ Eye glasses, contact lenses and/or dentures and their cases.
	☐ This document, with the items you have completed checked off
	☐ Book to read while waiting.
	☐ A small amount of money if you want (but no more than \$10).
	☐ Cell phone OK but leave all other valuables at home, eg wallet, other electronic devices
	If you are staying overnight:
	\square Also bring toiletries, such as toothbrush, toothpaste, dental floss, hair comb.
	☐ Arrange to have your family or friend bring in any other personal items once you are admitted to a bed.
